 - 5.1 Student council introduced the New Student Council representatives.
 - Brianna and Andrew reported on Student Council activities:
 - Establishing a date to send out an email to elementary teachers regarding artwork for an upcoming mall gallery.
 - -Planning an area to display artwork for all students, including junior high.
 - Reported on Athletics and Communications:
 - -Working on intramurals and student vs. teacher events.
 - -Planning a fundraiser for a school or animal charity.
 - -Finalizing an informational slideshow and working on creating a social media account for school news.
 - Reported on Social Justice Awareness and Student Engagement and Culture:
 - Working on more elementary exposure in announcements.
